## Patrol Report

Nebraska residents born after December 31, 1985, who operate a motorboat or personal watercraft in Nebraska, must have successfully completed the Nebraska boating safety course. They also must be 14 to operate personal watercraft or motorboats. The Beaver Lake Homeowners Association lake safety rules also follows this State of Nebraska Law. Beaver Lake residents please take note and make sure anyone operating a powered watercraft on our lake has taken this course. A minimum passing score of 75% is required on the test.

We have arranged for a class to be held at the Clubhouse on Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup>. Preregistration is required. (See page 9 of this Newsletter.)

Anyone born after December 31, 1985, who operates a motorboat or personal watercraft in Nebraska must have successfully completed the Nebraska boating safety course and always possess a valid certificate. Must be 14 to operate any motorized vessels.	All vessels towing a skier, tuber, etc. must have a wide-angle mirror or responsible observer at least 12 years old. To retrieve a skier, slow down, go counterclockwise.	
Each person must have a life preserver on vessel. Those under 13 must wear a life preserver at all times. Life preservers are mandatory on jet skis. You must have a life preserver readily available on a paddle board.	Must be 16 to tow a skier, tuber, or wake boarder. It is unlawful to jump a wake with a boat within 50years (150 feet).	
All boating traffic must travel counter clockwise.	Use a 12 x 12 high-visibility orange flag when a skier, tuber, etc., goes down.	
Each boat must have a marine fire extinguisher. (Check expiration dates!)	All boating traffic must travel counterclockwise.	
Skiing hours – it is unlawful to water ski, tube, etc. from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.	Never jump the wake of a boat that is towing a skier, tuber or wake boarder.	
Vessels will stay at least 90 feet from shore when speeds exceed 5 mph	When passing another boat, pass to deep water (to the left)

## ♥ Important Voting Information ♥

### Proxy voting is now conducted by email. No paper proxy ballots will be sent via U. S. Mail.

Beaver Lake Association members may choose to vote in our elections either by proxy or in-person.

Members who choose to vote by proxy must register each year on our website. Annual registration is available between January 1 and the last Friday in April.

When you register to e-vote, you will need to provide your lot number, name of registered lot owner, and <u>an email you will have access to during election weekend</u>.

On Friday evening, May 17, you will receive an email with a link to your electronic ballot. You will have until 3 pm on Sunday, May 19 to vote. To vote, click the link to open your ballot, select your choices, confirm, and submit.

- ► Signing up for our email newsletter does NOT register you to e-vote.
- Previous registration to e-vote does NOT register you to e-vote in subsequent elections. Annual registration keeps our voter lists up to date.
- ► If you register to e-vote by proxy, you will be ineligible to vote in person too.

Those who do not register to e-vote by proxy may vote in person as usual from 1-3pm at the clubhouse on the day of the election.



# Nature & Garden Club

Hard to believe that spring is right around the corner. Time for gardeners to start to prepare. Here are some ideas gathered from multiple sources on the web. Here are some ideas for March and April.

#### March:

- Prune shrubs that flower on new wood.
- Trim your ornamental grasses
- Spray fruit trees
- Start cleaning flower and vegetable beds
- Remove surface rust from tools and outdoor furniture.
- If you haven't already start transplants indoors per package directions
- Plan your vegetable garden. Consider rotating the vegetables to reduce insect and disease
- Buy a notebook and use it to keep all your gardening information. List what you plant in the garden. Include the name of seed companies, plant name, variety, planting date, and harvest date. During the growing season keep notes on how well the plant does. If the variety is susceptible to disease, record what was used to treat any problems. All this information will be helpful in planning future gardens.
- Place birdhouses outdoors as birds will begin nesting soon
- In late March you can begin planting peas, spinach and carrots
- Consider getting your soil tested. There are several companies that can provide you advice. Soil Kit is but one example.

**April** – sources vary a bit, but I use April 29<sup>th</sup> as the last frost date for our area for my garden planning. To be safe, many wait until Mother's Day to plant outdoors.

- Examples of frost tolerant vegetables that can be planted in April include: broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, chives, kale, onions, parsley, kohlrabi, lettuce and beets. You might be able to plant potatoes as long as the ground temperature is 50 degrees
  - Trim and divide perennials
  - Plant Summer bulbs
  - Create new garden beds
  - Feed shrubs and roses
  - Take cuttings
  - Aerate and overseed your lawn
  - Plant dormant strawberry and asparagus roots

• Make your first application of pre-emergence herbicides to control warm-

season annual grassy weeds, like crabgrass and foxtail, between April 20-May 5.

• Fertilize established asparagus and rhubarb plants.

# Mowing Notice

## Attention Please!

This notice is regarding your lot at Beaver Lake. This is your one and only notice to mow and maintain your lot and road rightof-way during the 2024 mowing season. You <u>will not</u> be given a notice each time your lot needs mowed. If the length of the grass, weeds, or any other growth reaches or exceeds 15" in length (as stated in the Beaver Lake Handbook,) it

will be mowed under the direction of Beaver Lake Association at a cost of \$125 per mowing of the lot or \$62.50 per mowing of the ditch and/or embankments. The cost of the mowing will be billed to the owner of record.

Once the owner receives a bill for mowing, it must be paid within 30 days. After 30 days delinquent, the account is turned over to the Association attorney for processing. The Beaver Lake Association does not wish to be in the mowing business, so we are asking that you please make arrangements for your lot to be mowed and maintained until the growth stops in late October. Remember that the mowing responsibility includes the road right-of-way. If you have any questions about the location of your lot, please notify us at 402-235-2241. Mowing contractors can be found on the Beaver Lake website. Please utilize one of them and save yourself some money. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.
